
5. Throughout the time period from 1950 to 2006, I have used the road myself for county road maintenance.





other vehicles from the general public using the road at various times for the uses described in the previous paragraph plus access to landfill, hunting, wood gathering, recreation and travel in and through the area.




8. Prior to 1976, I observed graders performing maintenance and construction activities on the road.


